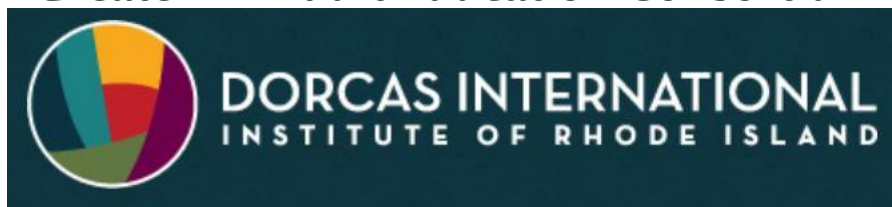

Adult Basic Literacy (ABL)- Provides students who have little or no literacy skills to further develop basic reading, writing, and math abilities for a 1st to 3rd grade level.

English as a Second Language Acquisition (ESOL)- The English course is designed to develop a student's reading, writing, and verbal skills. Our mission is to empower learners with the communication skills necessary for life and work in the United States. We offer English in 6 levels:

- **Basic**
- **Beginner 1**
- **Beginner 2**
- **Intermediate 1**
- **Intermediate 2**
- **Advanced**

Digital Literacy

The Basic computer course provides instruction for students with little or no computer experience. This course covers general computer knowledge, Microsoft Windows, Internet use and safety, and email. The Microsoft Office course provides those with basic computer skills an introduction to computers as well as to Microsoft Word, Excel, and PowerPoint.

Each course ends with an opportunity to receive a Northstar Certification. Certificate tests are given in English. More information about Northstar can be found at: www.digitalliteracyassessment.org.

General Education Development (GED) -

Pre-GED

This Spanish **Pre-GED** course (CONEVyT) prepares students to obtain their high school equivalency. It is a prep class for students who have a 4th-8th grade education. This class develops basic math, reading and writing skills in preparation for GED I.

GED I and II

GED I and II are intermediate level classes for those who have a 9th grade education or higher. They cover advanced math, science, social studies, necessary to pass the GED exam

Integrated English Literacy and Civics Education (IELCE)- The Citizenship program assists students in their efforts to pass the US Naturalization Exam. The preparatory course is designed for those students with an intermediate level of English fluency.

Bridge to Careers (B2C) is a free college and career preparation program for adults seeking apprenticeship, job training programs, certificate programs and college degree programs. This program involves career awareness and planning, basic skills development for reading, writing, mathematics, digital literacy, and test preparation.

Vocational Bridge Programs (Spring 2019) - Pre-Training programs designed for pathways for Rhode Island College's Medical Assistant Program and Roger Williams University Business Office Specialist for adults.

Job Development/Job Club- The Job Club is a free educational program that boosts an individual's skills to facilitate an effective navigation of employment opportunities. The program provides support with tools and trainings for the improvement of the employment seekers abilities, development of a proficient resume, enhancement of teamwork practices, empowerment of the individual's sense of belonging, and enhancement of the participant's employment.

RI-BEST Medical Assistant

This certificate program prepares students for a career as a Medical Assistant. Skills gained: medical terminology, electronic charting, clinical testing, basic pharmacology, HIPAA training, first aid, and CPR while earning college credit (including ESOL courses offered as appropriate).

Bookkeeping and Accounting

The courses apply the theory and practice of double-entry bookkeeping, use of journals and ledgers, preparation of basic payroll records, worksheet statements, bank statement reconciliations, adjusting and closing entries.

Bookkeeping Plus (contextualized training)

Incorporates remediation and/or English for Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL) as needed for each individual student.
